6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the powers and duties
7 of the local boundary commission; and pro-
8 viding for an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 44.19.260(a) is amended to read:

11 (a) The local boundary commission shall

12 (1) make studies of local government boundary
13 problems;

14 (2) develop proposed standards and procedures for
15 changing local boundary lines; [AND]

16 (3) consider a local government boundary change
17 requested of it by the legislature, the director of local
18 affairs, or a political subdivision of the state; and

19 (4) develop proposed standards and procedures for
20 the extension of services and ordinances of incorporated
21 cities into contiguous areas for limited purposes and prepare
22 transition schedules and prorated tax mill levies as well as
23 standards for participation by voters of these contiguous
24 areas in the affairs of the incorporated cities furnishing
25 services.

27 (b) The local boundary commission may

28 (1) conduct meetings and hearings to consider

to local government boundary changes, including extensions of services by incorporated cities into contiguous areas and matters related to extension of services; and

(2) present [PROPOSED LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOUNDARY CHANGES] to the legislature during the first 10 days of a regular session proposed local government boundary changes, including gradual extension of services of incorporated cities into contiguous areas and transition schedules providing for total assimilation of the contiguous area and its full participation in the affairs of the incorporated city within a period not to exceed five years.

* Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on July 1, 1964.
