6 For an Act entitled: "An Act creating the Governor's Employment
7 Advisory Commission; and providing for an
8 effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 44.19 is amended by adding new sections to
11 read:

12 ARTICLE 7

13 Sec. 44.19.450. GOVERNOR'S EMPLOYMENT ADVISORY COM-
14 MISSION. There is hereby created in the office of the gov-
15 ernor, the Governor's Employment Advisory Commission.

16 Sec. 44.19.460. COMPOSITION OF COMMISSION. The
17 Governor's Employment Advisory Commission consists of the
18 following persons:

- 19 (1) One member of the State Senate;
20 (2) One member of the State House of Representatives;
21 (3) One representative of the armed forces;
22 (4) Two representatives from industry or management,

23 and

- 24 (5) Two representatives of labor organizations.

25 Sec. 44.19.470. APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS. The governor
26 shall appoint all members of the Commission.

27 Sec. 44.19.480. TERM OF MEMBERSHIP. The term of member-
28 ship for persons appointed to the Commission is three years.

29 Sec. 44.19.490. PURPOSE OF COMMISSION. The Commission

1 is created to advise the governor of problems of unemploy-
2 ment and underemployment in particular occupational and geo-
3 graphic areas and to recommend measures for the elimination
4 of these problems and for the attainment of full employment
5 in Alaska.

6 Sec. 44.19.500. POWERS OF THE COMMISSION. In its study
7 of the problems of unemployment and underemployment the Com-
8 mission may

9 (1) conduct investigations and hearings;

10 (2) appoint an executive committee or subcommittees
11 to carry out its functions;

12 (3) cooperate with federal and independent agencies.

13 Sec. 44.19.510. COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES. Members of
14 the Commission receive no salary, but are entitled to per diem
15 and travel expenses authorized by law for other boards and
16 commissions.

17 Sec. 44.19.520. QUORUM. Four members shall constitute
18 a quorum, and shall consist of at least one member represent-
19 ing labor, one member representing industry and management
20 and one legislator.

21 Sec. 44.19.530. MEETINGS. The Commission shall meet at
22 least once a year and shall submit a written report to the
23 legislature on February 1 of each year.

24 * Sec. 2. Upon initial appointment two members serve for one
25 year, two members serve for two years, and three members serve for
26 three years.

27 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage
28 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
