5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to state action made neces-  
7 sary by the natural disaster of March 27,  
8 1964; and providing for an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 \* Section 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this Act is to give the  
11 executive branch the powers and duties necessary to meet the  
12 state emergency created by the earthquake of March 27, 1964.

13 \* Sec. 2. RECONSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC PROPERTY. The governor  
14 may establish priorities for reconstructing damaged and destroyed  
15 public property, giving the highest priorities to reconstructing  
16 facilities the condition of which endangers life and the next  
17 highest priorities to reconstructing communication and transpor-  
18 tation facilities. The governor, using any money appropriated to  
19 him by the legislature for this purpose and any made available  
20 from other sources, shall proceed to reconstruct damaged and  
21 destroyed state property.

22 \* Sec. 3. ASSISTANCE TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS. The governor may  
23 provide local governments in the disaster area with financial and  
24 technical assistance in carrying out their functions.

25 \* Sec. 4. MAINTENANCE OF CONTINUITY. To protect the inhabi-  
26 tants of the disaster area from crippling economic consequences  
27 of the earthquake, the governor, by regulation, may use money made  
28 available to him for disaster relief to match any available federal  
29 money that would aid in the economic reconstruction and development

1 of the disaster area.

2 \* Sec. 5. COOPERATION WITH FEDERAL GOVERNMENT. The governor  
3 may accept any federal money made available for the relief or re-  
4 construction of the disaster area, or money made available for  
5 those purposes from other sources and may comply with all terms  
6 and conditions attached to the acceptance of that money.

7 \* Sec. 6. DELEGATION OF POWER. The governor may not delegate  
8 the power to promulgate regulations authorized by this Act.

9 \* Sec. 7. This Act expires on October 30, 1964.

10 \* Sec. 8. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage  
11 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
