BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE SENATE CON-

WHEREAS, the success of the Olympic Ski Trials held at Mt.

Alyeska in 1963 demonstrated the suitability of the mountain and

the facilities there for expert skiing events; and

WHEREAS, the central location of Anchorage, its ready

14

accessibility by air from all parts of the globe, its many fine

15

restaurants, hotels, and inns, and its excellent winter climate

16

all recommend it as a place eminently suited as a center for

winter sporting competitions; and

WHEREAS, it would be enormously beneficial to the future

development of the state to focus the attention of the world on

the enormous skiing potential found in the state; and

WHEREAS, the flow of competitors and visitors to the state

for an event of the significance of the 1967 Winter Olympic games

would be of great economic importance to the whole state;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska Travel Division of the Depart-

possible action to ensure that maximum consideration is given by
