5 Relating to the fishery conserva-  
6 tion and propagation contributions  
7 of the U. S. Army in Alaska.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

9 WHEREAS, the U. S. Army at Fort Richardson has always support-  
10 ed a program of fish and game conservation and has enforced strict  
11 adherence to fish and game regulations; and

12 WHEREAS, the Fort Richardson command has for five years  
13 successfully reared rainbow trout and silver salmon and released  
14 them in the Palmer-Anchorage area with the result that six, eight  
15 and ten-pound rainbow trout are being caught by civilian and  
16 military personnel in that area; and

17 WHEREAS, in recognition of the depletion of Alaska's state  
18 and finest fish, the king salmon, the U. S. Army in Alaska is now  
19 rearing 13,500 king salmon fry, an amount approximately two-thirds  
20 of the current commercial catch in Cook Inlet; and

21 WHEREAS, this program of planting fingerlings in the depleted  
22 streams will assist Nature in replenishing the king salmon run;

23 BE IT RESOLVED that the post commander, officers and men of  
24 Fort Richardson are commended for their participation in and con-  
25 tributions to the conservation and propagation of Alaska's fishery  
26 resource; and be it

27 FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to  
28 the Honorable Cyrus R. Vance, Secretary of the Army, and Major  
29 General Ned D. Moore, Commanding General, U. S. Army, Alaska.
