BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

8

WHEREAS the Legislature is being requested to provide for

9

money for expanding vocational education facilities; and

10

WHEREAS the Legislature recognizes that vocational education

11

is vitally important to the people of the state and to the general

12

economy; and

13

WHEREAS no reliable estimate has been made of the extent of

14

need for new vocational education facilities;

15

BE IT RESOLVED that the Governor is respectfully requested to

16

direct the Department of Education to prepare a report to be sub-

17

mitted to the Legislative Council by November 1, 1964,

18

(1) containing reliable estimates of the number of per-

19

sons in the state who would profit from vocational education

20

and where they live;

21

(2) explaining, if new facilities are needed, what kind

22

of facilities are needed, where they should be built, the

23

order in which they should be built, and how much they would

24

probably cost;

25

(3) stating whether or not it is feasible to rent

26

rather than construct facilities in any of the localities in

27

which new facilities are needed;

28

(4) showing the degree to which vocational education

29

programs could and should be integrated into the regular high

1 school curricula, and the effect that integration would have
2 on the need for constructing new vocational education facil-
3 ities and for expanding high school facilities;

4 (5) projecting estimates and plans for as far into the
5 future as possible, but at least for the next five years; and
6 be it

7 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Council is directed to
8 add to the report any comments or recommendations it has, and to
9 distribute the report to the members of the Legislature at the
10 beginning of the 1965 legislative session.
