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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

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ARTICLE 1. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER.

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Sec. 08.99.010. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER. This chapter

5 ARTICLE 2. BOARD ORGANIZATION

6 Sec. 08.99.030. APPOINTMENT AND TERMS OF OFFICE.

7 Unless another number is provided in the board's constitutive  
8 statute, a board consists of five members. Members are  
9 appointed by the governor and confirmed by the legislature  
10 for staggered terms of three years. A member serves at the  
11 pleasure of the governor. The governor shall fill a vacancy  
12 by appointment for the unexpired term. A member serves until  
13 his successor is appointed.

14 Sec. 08.99.040. QUALIFICATIONS OF A BOARD MEMBER. The  
15 governor shall appoint each member on the basis of the  
16 member's interest in public affairs, his good judgment, his  
17 knowledge and ability in the field of action of the board to  
18 which he is appointed, and with a view to providing diversity  
19 of interest and points of view in the membership.

20 Sec. 08.99.050. BOARD MEETINGS AND OFFICERS. (a) A  
21 board shall hold a regular annual meeting. A board may hold  
22 special meetings at the call of the chairman or of three  
23 board members, with prior approval of the governor.

24 (b) A majority of a board is a quorum for conducting  
25 business.

26 (c) A board shall elect its officers.

27 Sec. 08.99.060. ASSISTANTS. A board may, with the  
28 consent of the governor, employ assistants to

- 29 (1) prepare questions on examinations, especially

1 in areas in which no board member is an expert;

6 member is entitled to transportation expenses and per diem  
7 allowances specified in AS 39.20.180.

8 ARTICLE 3. ADMINISTRATION OF BOARD AFFAIRS

9 Sec. 08.99.090. ADMINISTRATIVE DUTIES OF THE DEPARTMENT

10 (a) The department shall furnish administrative services for  
11 a board, including

12 (1) collecting fees and issuing receipts;

13 (2) keeping records of receipts and disbursements;

14 (3) distributing and receiving application forms;

15 (4) notifying an applicant whether or not the  
16 board has accepted his application;

17 (5) designating the date on which annual examina-  
18 tions are to be held;

19 (6) at least 30 days before an examination is to  
20 be held, publishing notice that it is to be held;

21 (7) printing examinations;

22 (8) providing space for holding examinations;

23 (9) proctoring examinations;

24 (10) notifying applicants of the results of the  
25 examination;

26 (11) printing and distributing uniform license  
27 certificates, duplicate certificates to replace lost ones,  
28 and pocket-sized recognition cards;

29 (12) sending notice, before December 1 of each

1 year, that licenses must be renewed;

2 (13) keeping a current register of licensees;

3 (14) employing secretarial assistants;

4 (15) replying to routine requests for information;

5 (16) printing and distributing forms and informa-  
6 tional bulletins;

7 (17) maintaining records and completed examina-  
8 tions;

9 (18) recording suspensions and revocations of  
10 licenses.

11 (b) The department shall allow members of a board free  
12 access to its records concerning the board's activities.

13 Sec. 08.99.100. DEPARTMENT REGULATIONS. The department  
14 shall adopt procedural regulations describing

15 (1) how it conducts an examination;

16 (2) how a person applies to take an examination,  
17 or applies for a license;

18 (3) what is contained in application forms.

19 Sec. 08.99.110. DEPARTMENT REPORT. (a) The department  
20 for the preceding year, shall annually report on

21 (1) the number of persons who applied for a  
22 license;

23 (2) the number of applications that were rejected;

24 (3) the reasons for each rejection;

25 (4) the number of licenses that were revoked or  
26 suspended;

27 (5) the reasons for each revocation or suspension.

28 (b) The department shall file the report with the  
29 legislative council before January 31 of each year for the

1 preceding calendar year. The council shall distribute copies  
2 of the report to the members of the legislature during each  
3 legislative session.

4 Sec. 08.99.120. SALE OF REGISTER. The department shall  
5 offer for sale to the public, publications containing the  
6 names, addresses, license classifications, and professional  
7 associations of persons licensed by a board. The department  
8 shall sell the publications at a price designed to recover  
9 costs of compilation, publication, and distribution.

10 ARTICLE 4. LICENSES

11 Sec. 08.99.140. EXAMINATION. A person qualified to  
12 take an examination who passes an examination given under  
13 this chapter is entitled to be licensed.

14 Sec. 08.99.150. OBJECT OF EXAMINATION. The only pur-  
15 pose of an examination is to disqualify those whose lack of  
16 knowledge or skill in the profession or occupation for which  
17 they have applied for a license would create a serious risk  
18 of injury to the public interest the board is created to  
19 protect.

20 Sec. 08.99.160. ADMINISTRATION OF EXAMINATION. The  
21 department shall offer examinations prepared by a board at  
22 least once a year and more frequently if more than two per-  
23 sons who are not eligible for a temporary license without  
24 examination, and who are qualified to take an examination,  
25 petition the department for an additional examination. Ex-  
26 aminations shall be so administered that one who grades a  
27 written examination does not know whose paper he is grading.  
28 The department shall maintain files of examination papers.

29 A person is entitled to inspect his examination paper for the

1 purpose of challenging the propriety of its questions, the  
2 method of grading, or the accuracy of grading. Every two  
3 years the department shall have published and sell at cost  
4 copies of examinations for the preceding two years. The  
5 board shall prepare a new examination at least every two  
6 years. If a person fails to take an examination after he has  
7 paid the application fee, the department shall refund the  
8 fee.

9 Sec. 08.99.170. RE-EXAMINATION. A person who fails an  
10 examination may apply for a subsequent examination, but shall  
11 pay the application fee each time he applies. He may not  
12 petition for an additional examination under sec. 160 of this  
13 chapter, but may take one if it is offered.

15 son is entitled to take an examination if he

16 (1) meets requirements specified in the constitu-

21 of the department;

22 (3) pays the application fee.

24 fee, and out-of-state license fee is \$15. If a board is  
25 authorized to charge a fee for another purpose, that annual  
26 fee is \$15. The fee for a duplicate license is \$2. There is  
27 no fee for a temporary license.

29 shall deposit money collected under this chapter in the

1 general fund.

2           Sec. 08.99.210. ANNUAL RENEWAL. A person who passes  
3 the examination is licensed without payment of further fee.  
4 To remain licensed, a person must pay the renewal fee before  
5 February 1 of each year. The department shall send a renewal  
6 tag to a person who pays his fee. The tag is to be attached  
7 to the license. A person who allows his license to lapse is  
8 entitled to have it renewed by paying accrued renewal fees.  
9 He is entitled to have it renewed without taking an examina-  
10 tion unless his license has lapsed more than five years, in  
11 which case he is required to take an examination if the  
12 board finds that additional evidence of his continued fitness  
13 to practice is required.

14           Sec. 08.99.220. INACTIVE LICENSE. (a) A person  
15 licensed by a board may become inactive by returning to the  
16 department his license certificate and a form provided by  
17 the department. In the form, he shall state the date on  
18 which he intends to become inactive. His inactive status  
19 begins on the date stated. The department shall issue him  
20 an inactive license certificate.

21           (b) None of the rights, powers, duties, or liabilities  
22 applicable to a licensed person apply to a person who is  
23 inactive. An inactive person is not required to pay a fee.

24           (c) A person who is inactive may become active by  
25 returning to the department his inactive license certificate,  
26 the renewal fee for the year, if he becomes active more than  
27 five months before February 1 following, and a form provided  
28 by the department. In the form he shall state the date on  
29 which he intends to become active. His active status begins

1 on the date stated. The department shall send him a license  
2 certificate. A person is entitled to change from an inactive  
3 to an active status without examination if he has not been  
4 inactive more than five years. If he has been inactive more  
5 than five years he is required to take an examination if the  
6 board finds that additional evidence of his continued fitness  
7 to practice is required.

8 ARTICLE 5. GENERAL PROVISIONS.
