6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the public school foun-
7 dation program."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 14.17.030(b) is amended to read:

10 (b) The required local tax effort for each district is
11 the amount of revenue raised from local sources which is
12 equivalent to the amount which would be raised from a 3.5
13 mill levy on the full and true value of taxable real and per-
14 sonal property within the district. The amount of the re-
15 quired local tax effort may be raised from any source avail-
16 able to the district and does not have to be derived from
17 property taxes.

18 * Sec. 2. AS 14.17.050(d) is amended to read:

19 (d) Each district is entitled to the number of teacher
20 units for elementary schools which corresponds to the average
21 daily membership for its elementary schools in the following
22 elementary schedule. Each district is entitled to the number
23 of teacher units for secondary schools which corresponds to
24 the average daily membership for its secondary schools in the
25 following secondary schedule. If a school district has two
26 or more secondary attendance centers, it shall separately
27 compute the allowable number of teacher units for each of its
28 secondary attendance centers which has an average daily mem-
29 bership of 301 or more pupils.

* Sec. 3. AS 14.17.050(g) is amended by adding a new paragraph to read:

(3) a school district conducting programs in special education in one or more buildings will be entitled to a teacher unit as an allowance for a principal for special education if there are eight or more classes for special education within the district.

* Sec. 4. AS 14.17.070(a) is amended to read:

(a) The attendance center allotment for each district is the product of the number of attendance centers in the school district times \$1,000. A district conducting more than seven classes in special education is entitled to an additional attendance center allotment of \$1,000.

* Sec. 5. AS 14.17.250(12) is amended to read:

(12) "teacher"

(A) means a regular or special teacher, principal, supervisor, superintendent, librarian, director of pupil personnel, or other member of the teaching or professional staff engaged in the service of a public elementary or secondary school for whom certification is required as a condition of employment;

(B) includes a nurse in a public elementary or secondary school.
