6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the public school foun-  
7 dation program; and providing for an effec-  
8 tive date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 \* Section 1. AS 14.17.030(b) is amended to read:

11 (b) The required local tax effort for each district is  
12 the amount of revenue raised from local sources which is  
13 equivalent to the amount which would be raised from a 3.5  
14 mill levy on the full and true value of taxable real and per-  
15 sonal property within the district. The amount of the re-  
16 quired local tax effort may be raised from any source avail-  
17 able to the district and does not have to be derived from  
18 property taxes.

19 \* Sec. 2. AS 14.17.050(d) is amended to read:

20 (d) Each district is entitled to the number of teacher  
21 units for elementary schools which corresponds to the average  
22 daily membership for its elementary schools in the following  
23 elementary schedule. Each district is entitled to the number  
24 of teacher units for secondary schools which corresponds to  
25 the average daily membership for its secondary schools in the  
26 following secondary schedule. If a school district has two  
27 or more secondary attendance centers, it shall separately  
28 compute the allowable number of teacher units for each of its  
29 secondary attendance centers which has an average daily mem-

8 special education in one or more buildings will be entitled  
9 to a teacher unit as an allowance for a principal for special  
10 education if there are eight or more classes for special  
11 education within the district.

12 \* Sec. 4. AS 14.17.070(a) is amended to read:

13 (a) The attendance center allotment for each district  
14 is the product of the number of attendance centers in the  
15 school district times \$1,000. A district conducting more than  
16 seven classes in special education is entitled to an additional  
17 attendance center allotment of \$1,000.

18 \* Sec. 5. AS 14.30.200 - 220, AS 14.30.240, and AS 14.30.290 -  
19 320 are repealed effective July 1, 1964.

20 \* Sec. 6. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage  
21 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
