6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the pay of teachers and
7 school administrators; and providing for an
8 effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 14.20.220 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

11 Sec. 14.20.220. MINIMUM TEACHERS' SALARY SCALE BY
12 SENATE DISTRICT. (a) The school board of each school dis-
13 trict in the Southeastern Senate District shall pay a regu-
14 larly qualified teacher employed by it a salary not less
15 than that set out in this subsection.

16 (1) The base salary of a teacher with three years'
17 training is \$4,750 for a teacher with no public school ex-
18 perience in the state. This salary is augmented by \$150 for
19 each year of public school experience in the state up to and
20 including four years.

21 (2) The base salary for a teacher holding a
22 bachelor's degree and having the requisite number of hours in
23 education is \$5,500. This salary is augmented by the sum of
24 .04 times the base for each year of public school experience
25 in the state up to and including eight years.

26 (3) The base salary for a teacher having a master's
27 degree and the required number of hours of education is
28 \$6,000. This salary is augmented by the sum of .04 times
29 the base for each year of teaching experience in the state

1 up to and including 12 years.

2 (b) The school board of each school in the Southcentral
3 Senate District shall pay the amount set out in (a) of this
4 section plus \$400.

5 (c) The school board of each school in the Central and
6 Northwest Senate Districts and that part of the Southcentral
7 Senate District lying west of 152° West Longitude shall pay
8 the amount set out in (a) of this section plus \$700.

9 (d) The department, as the operating agency of schools
10 outside school districts, shall pay a regularly qualified
11 teacher employed by the state a salary of not less than \$500
12 a year above the salary set out in (a), (b), and (c) of this
13 section.

14 (e) Not more than four years of public school experience
15 outside the state may be substituted for a like period of
16 public school experience in the state when a teacher's posi-
17 tion on the salary scale is established

18 * Sec. 2. AS 14.20.230 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

19 Sec. 14.20.230. SUPERINTENDENTS' SALARIES. The school
20 boards of school districts and the department as the operating
21 agency for schools outside school districts shall pay a regu-
22 larly qualified superintendent a salary not less than the
23 allowable base for his position on the teacher's scale pro-
24 vided in sec. 220(a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) of this chapter, plus

25 (1) 20 per cent of the base for a superintendent of a
26 district or state school with an average daily membership of
27 less than 500;

28 (2) 25 per cent of the base for a superintendent of a
29 district or state school with an average daily membership of

Sec. 14.20.240. SALARIES OF PRINCIPALS AND VICE

PRINCIPALS. The school boards of school districts and the department as the operating agency for schools outside districts shall pay each regularly qualified principal and vice principal a salary not less than the allowable base for his position on the teachers' scale provided in sec. 220(a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) of this chapter, plus

(1) 15 per cent of the base for a principal;

(2) 10 per cent of the base for a vice principal.

* Sec. 4. This Act takes effect July 1, 1963.
