5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the location of the
7 principal offices of state government; and
8 providing for an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. There is established a committee consisting of the
11 eight senators serving senate districts A, E, J, and N. The com-
12 mittee shall determine the appropriate site for the location of
13 the principal offices of state government.

14 * Sec. 2. In considering sites for the location of the princi-
15 pal offices of state government, the committee shall consider
16 (1) the best interests of the people of the state;
17 (2) availability of existing physical facilities;
18 (3) population distribution;
19 (4) costs, actual and contingent, to the state of various
20 locations;

21 (5) the effect on the economy of the state and upon the
22 local economies of districts where offices are located;

23 (6) accessibility to major transportation facilities;
24 (7) availability of room for expansion;
25 (8) need for immediate expansion; and
26 (9) principles of governmental administration and political
27 science.

28 * Sec. 3. The committee shall determine the probable needs of
29 the state through 1975 for the housing of governmental offices

1 and shall make an inventory of existing facilities.

2 * Sec. 4. The committee may hold hearings throughout the state
3 to aid in its deliberations.

4 * Sec. 5. The committee may use all the professional and tech-
5 nical services necessary to its function which are available to
6 the state, including the services of independent authorities under
7 contract to the state and all employees of the state, and may
8 request any information or studies which it considers necessary
9 from any office or division of the state government.

10 * Sec. 6. The committee shall meet within 60 days after the
11 adjournment of the legislature upon the call of the governor and
12 shall select a chairman from their membership. A majority of the
13 committee constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.

14 * Sec. 7. Members of the committee are entitled to receive
15 transportation and per diem of \$35 per day in lieu of actual ex-
16 penses for time actually spent at meetings and in performing the
17 duties imposed by this Act.

18 * Sec. 8. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the
19 president of the senate of a senator from the same major senate
20 district as the senator whose absence creates the vacancy.

21 * Sec. 9. The committee shall submit a report to the Second
22 Session of the Third Legislature, setting out its findings and
23 recommendations.

24 * Sec. 10. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage
25 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
