For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the construction of low
7 standard roads giving access to Alaska lands;
8 and providing for an effective date."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

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* Section 1. AS 19.30.060 is amended to read:

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Sec. 19.30.060. PURPOSE. It is the purpose of secs.

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60 - 100 of this chapter to provide access to [SUBDIVIDED]

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state lands which are programmed for surface disposal, and

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to provide access roads at the lowest possible cost.

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* Sec. 2. AS 19.30.080 is amended to read:

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Sec. 19.30.080. CONSTRUCTION STANDARDS AND MAINTENANCE.

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Access roads constructed under secs. 60 - 100 of this chapter

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shall be of low standard, not necessarily suitable for all

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weather use. The state is not under obligation to maintain

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these roads. Right of way width shall be determined by the

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division of lands and the Department of Highways if constructed

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outside local government units which have zoning ordinances.

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If such roads are constructed within the boundaries of local

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government units which have zoning ordinances the width shall

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conform to subdivision control ordinances of such local

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government units. [BUILDINGS SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED AT LEAST

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150 FEET FROM THE CENTER LINE OF SUCH ROADS.] Contracts for

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the work shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder

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qualified to contract with the state.

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1 * Sec. 3. AS 19.30.090 is amended to read:

2 Sec. 19.30.090. PAYMENT OF CONSTRUCTION COSTS IN LAND
3 CREDIT CERTIFICATES. The cost of constructing access roads
4 to [SUBDIVIDED] state lands shall be paid in freely trans-
5 ferable land credit certificates which may be applied toward
6 the purchase or lease of any state lands under the jurisdic-
7 tion of the division of lands, except tide, submerged and
8 shore lands and lands belonging to the state which have been
9 obtained by escheat, purchase, or any means other than by
10 general land grant. A land credit certificate is valid for
11 a period of 20 years after issue. After the expiration of
12 20 years from date of issue the holder may not start an
13 action against the state or any person based upon the certifi-
14 cate. The method of disposing of lands and resources and
15 restrictions upon their disposal established by law or regula-
16 tion are in no way affected by the use of land credit
17 certificates.

18 * Sec. 4. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage
19 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
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
