7 ment Committee; and providing for an effec-

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 44.45 is amended by adding new sections to
11 read:

12 ARTICLE 7
13 RAMPART DAM DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE
14 Sec. 44.45.180. CREATION OF COMMITTEE. Upon completion
15 of current Rampart Dam studies and a favorable feasibility
16 report, there will be created in the Department of Economic
17 Development and Planning the Rampart Dam Development Commit-
18 tee.

19 Sec. 44.45.190. COMPOSITION AND TERM OF OFFICE. The
20 committee consists of ten citizens of Alaska appointed by the
21 governor on a nonpartisan basis to give representation on the
22 committee to major groups interested in the economic develop-
23 ment of the Yukon Basin and Alaska as a whole. Members of
24 the committee are appointed for three-year terms, except that
25 initial appointments shall be four for three years, three for
26 two years, and three for one year.

27 Sec. 44.45.200. COMPENSATION AND PER DIEM. Members of
28 the committee serve without compensation but receive the same
29 transportation costs and per diem as state officials and

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employees.

Sec. 44.45.210. QUORUM AND CHAIRMAN. (a) A majority of the committee constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business of the committee.

(b) The governor shall appoint a chairman for the committee.

Sec. 44.45.220. POWERS AND DUTIES. The committee shall

(1) use every appropriate means to inform the United States Congress and the public, both inside and outside Alaska, of Rampart Dam and Alaska's power and resource potential, and how development of this potential would be in the best interest of the people of the United States and the State of Alaska;

(2) whenever possible assist all public and private agencies and organizations planning or encouraging power development on the Yukon River or its basin; and

(3) recommend to the governor action to further these purposes.

* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
