5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act creating advisory organizations for  
7 the 'on-base' schools; and providing for an  
8 effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 \* Section 1. AS 14.10 is amended by adding new sections to  
11 read:

12 ARTICLE 5. ADVISORY BOARDS AND  
13 COMMISSION FOR ON-BASE SCHOOLS.

14 Sec. 14.10.410. ADVISORY BOARD ESTABLISHED. There may be  
15 established an on-base advisory board for each on-base  
16 school. It is composed of five members, elected by persons  
17 over 19 years of age in the area served by the on-base  
18 school.

19 Sec. 14.10.420. TERM OF OFFICE AND VACANCIES. The  
20 terms of the initial board members are staggered so that one  
21 member is re-elected each year. Thereafter, board members  
22 are elected to five-year terms. The board members shall  
23 appoint a person to fill a vacancy until the next regular  
24 election, at which time an election will be held for the re-  
25 maining portion of the vacated term.

26 Sec. 14.10.430. DUTIES OF AN ADVISORY BOARD. An ad-  
27 visory board shall advise the Board of Education and the  
28 Department of Education of problems concerning school adminis-  
29 tration and policy for its school, and may assist the Board

1 of Education and the department in solving the problems.

2 Sec. 14.10.440. ADVISORY COMMISSION ESTABLISHED. There may  
3 be established the On-Base Advisory Commission. It consists  
4 of one member from each advisory board, elected by the ad-  
5 visory board.

6 Sec. 14.10.450. DUTIES OF THE ADVISORY COMMISSION. The  
7 advisory commission shall advise the Board of Education and  
8 the department of general problems concerning the on-base  
9 schools in the state, and may assist the Board of Education  
10 and the department in solving the problems.

11 Sec. 14.10.460. ACCESS TO DEPARTMENT RECORDS. An ad-  
12 visory board and the advisory commission have access to  
13 department records under AS 09.25.110 and 09.25.120.

14 Sec. 14.10.470. REPORT. The advisory commission shall  
15 make an annual report to the governor on problems concerning  
16 on-base schools, and may recommend corrective action.

17 Sec. 14.10.480. DEFINITIONS. In secs. 410-470 of this  
18 chapter

19 (1) "advisory board" means an On-Base Advisory  
20 Board;

21 (2) "advisory commission" means the On-Base Advisory  
22 Commission.

23 \* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage  
24 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
