BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 14.10.360 is amended to read:

Sec. 14.10.360. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent

of secs. 360 - 390 of this chapter to allow for some degree

12

of local policy determination in those areas where schools

13

are maintained solely by the state [, BUT NOT THOSE AREAS

14

SERVED BY "ON-BASE" SCHOOLS].

Sec. 14.10.370. ESTABLISHMENT OF ADVISORY SCHOOL BOARDS.

(a) There is established an advisory school board in each

18

community served by a rural school operated by the department.

19

If the state-operated school has an average daily enrollment

20

of less than 251 pupils, the advisory board consists of

21

three members. If the average daily enrollment is more than

22

250 pupils, the advisory board consists of five members.

23

(b) Voters qualified under sec. 395 of this chapter, at

24

an election, may create an on-base advisory school board.

4 N (b) Initial members of an advisory school board which  
5 E consists of five members when the board is created, are  
6 W elected; one to a one-year term, two to a two-year term, and  
7 two to a three-year term. Thereafter, all board members  
8 are elected to three-year terms.

9 (c) In the event that a three-member board is increased  
10 to a five-member board because of increased enrollment, the  
11 two additional members are elected for terms of three years  
12 M each.

13 A (d) Vacancies on advisory school boards occurring  
14 T between regular elections will be filled by the remaining  
15 T board members until the next regular election, at which  
16 E time an election will be held for the remaining portion  
17 R of the term.
