6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the Alaska Administra-
7 tive Code; and providing for an effective
8 date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 44.62 is amended by adding new sections to
11 read:

12 Sec. 44.62.132. DRAFTSMAN. The attorney general shall
13 assign to the secretary of state a legal draftsman with
14 training in administrative law, who shall

15 (1) draft all new regulations for all agencies,
16 advising the agencies of legal problems encountered, and
17 ensuring uniformity in drafting and numbering;

18 (2) make a substantive revision of the Alaska
19 Administrative Code under sec. 133 of this chapter;

20 (3) alert the agencies to statutes that need to
21 be implemented by regulations and advise the agencies of the
22 nature and uses of regulations;

23 (4) draft bills to be introduced by request of
24 the governor to transfer matter which should be statutory
25 law from the Alaska Administrative Code to the Alaska
26 Statutes and to clarify agency regulatory power when clari-
27 fication is needed.

28 Sec. 44.62.133. REVISION OF THE ALASKA ADMINISTRATIVE
29 CODE. (a) The draftsman appointed under sec. 132 of this

1 chapter shall substantively revise the Alaska Administrative
2 Code, proceeding subject by subject. The responsibility for
3 deciding on the content of each revision is that of the
4 promulgating agency. When the draftsman has completed the
5 revision of regulations relating to one subject and the
6 promulgating agency has approved the revision, the promulgat-
7 ing agency shall proceed to adopt the revision under secs.
8 180 - 290 of this chapter. Sec. 200 of this chapter does
9 not apply to the adoption of a substantive revision. The
10 notice of proposed adoption shall state that the promulgat-
11 ing agency proposes to adopt a substantive revision of regu-
12 lations relating to the subject to which the regulations
13 relate.

14 * Sec. 2. When enough regulations have been revised under
15 AS 44.62.133 for an estimate to be made of the probable number of
16 pages the Alaska Administrative Code will contain when it is
17 completely revised, the secretary of state shall report to the
18 legislature on costs and alternate methods of printing and index-
19 ing the revised code in a more readable, more easily maintained
20 form. The secretary of state shall give special attention to the
21 possibility of reprinting the code in the form used by the Alaska
22 Statutes and the Alaska Rules of Court Procedure and Administra-
23 tion.

24 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect July 1, 1964.
