6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to allotments for special
7 education under the public school foundation
8 program; and providing for an effective
9 date."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 * Section 1. AS 14.17.060 is amended to read:

12 Sec. 14.17.060. AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP ALLOTMENT.

13 (a) The average daily membership allotment for each district
14 is as follows:

15 (1) if the district is in the Southeastern Senate
16 District: \$140 times average daily membership;

17 (2) if the district is in the Southcentral Senate
18 District: \$150 times average daily membership;

19 (3) if the district is in the Central and North-
20 west Senate Districts and that part of the Southcentral
21 Senate District lying west of 152° west longitude: \$160 times
22 the average daily membership [ATTENDANCE].

23 (b) In addition to the average daily membership allot-
24 ment for each district there is an allotment for special
25 education of twice the dollar amount allowed in (a) of this
26 section times the average daily membership in special educa-
27 tion classes.

28 * Sec. 2. AS 14.17.070(a) is amended to read:

29 (a) The attendance center allotment for each district

1 is the product of the number of attendance centers in the
2 school district times \$1,000. A district conducting more
3 than two [SEVEN] classes in special education is entitled to
4 an additional attendance center allotment of \$1,000. A dis-
5 trict conducting one or two classes in special education is
6 entitled to an attendance center allotment of \$500.

7 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage
8 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
