6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the Alaska Bar Associa-  
7 tion; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 08.08.010 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

10 Sec. 08.08.010. THE ALASKA BAR ASSOCIATION AS A LEGAL  
11 ENTITY. The Alaska Bar Association, created by rules of the  
12 Supreme Court of Alaska, is recognized as a legal entity,  
13 with the power to use a common seal, sue and be sued, enter  
14 into contracts, and acquire, hold, encumber and dispose of  
15 real and personal property.

16 \* Sec. 2. AS 08.08.020 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

17 Sec. 08.08.020. UNLAWFUL PRACTICE OF LAW A MISDEMEANOR.  
18 Any person not an enrolled active member of the Alaska Bar  
19 Association who engages in the practice of law or who repre-  
20 sents himself as entitled to engage in the practice of law in  
21 this state, other than as permitted by order or rule of the  
22 Supreme Court of Alaska, is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon  
23 conviction is punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000,  
24 or by imprisonment for not more than one year, or by both.

25 \* Sec. 3. AS 08.08.030 - 08.08.250 are repealed. All records,  
26 assets, liabilities, and contractual obligations of any nature of  
27 the Alaska Bar Association in its existence under the Alaska  
28 Integrated Bar Act of 1955 (AS 08.08) continue as assets,
