5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act making certain appropriations; and
7 providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. The sum of \$100 is appropriated from the general
10 fund to reimburse Juneau Broadcasters, Inc., and William J. Wagner
11 and Irene F. Wagner for costs and attorney fees in accordance with
12 the judgment filed in the Superior Court, State of Alaska, First
13 District, at Juneau May 10, 1963, Civil Action File No. 63-14.

14 * Sec. 2. The sum of \$303.62 is appropriated from the general
15 fund to reimburse Ben Caldron and Sara Caldron for attorney fees
16 in accordance with the judgment filed in the Superior Court, State
17 of Alaska, Third District, at Anchorage, April 29, 1963.

18 * Sec. 3. The sum of \$583.95 is appropriated from the general
19 fund to reimburse Northern Consolidated Airlines for services
20 furnished the Alaska Court System, the Department of Health and
21 Welfare and the Department of Public Safety in prior fiscal years.

22 * Sec. 4. The sum of \$240 is appropriated from the general
23 fund to reimburse the Addressograph-Multigraph Corporation for
24 equipment furnished the Department of Revenue during the fiscal
25 year ending June 30, 1960.

26 * Sec. 5. The sum of \$323.87 is appropriated from the general
27 fund to reimburse the IBM Corporation for services furnished the
28 Department of Highways in prior fiscal years.

29 * Sec. 6. The sum of \$80.96 is appropriated from the general

1 fund to reimburse the General Services Administration for equip-
2 ment furnished the Alaska Court System during the fiscal year
3 ending June 30, 1960.

4 * Sec. 7. The sum of \$9,175 is appropriated from the general
5 fund to reimburse the Anchorage Independent School District for
6 school health examinations carried out for the Department of
7 Health and Welfare during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1961.

8 * Sec. 8. The sum of \$624 is appropriated from the general
9 fund to reimburse Dr J. Ray Langdon for consulting services
10 provided for the Department of Health and Welfare during the
11 fiscal year ending June 30, 1961.

12 * Sec. 9. The sum of \$28 is appropriated from the general
13 fund to reimburse Laurel Ragona for services furnished the Depart-
14 ment of Health and Welfare during the fiscal year ending June 30,
15 1962.

16 * Sec. 10. The sum of \$914.35 is appropriated from the general
17 fund to reimburse Frank W. Coletta for losses incurred as a result
18 of rendering services for the Department of Public Safety in July,
19 1963.

20 * Sec. 11. The sum of \$588.29 is appropriated from the general
21 fund to reimburse the Chugach Electric Association for services
22 furnished the Department of Military Affairs during 1957.

23 * Sec. 12. The sum of \$86.06 is appropriated from the general
24 fund to reimburse the Firestone Tire and Rubber Company for
25 supplies furnished the Department of Public Safety during 1959,
26 1960 and 1961.

27 * Sec. 13. The sum of \$15,000 is appropriated from the general
28 fund to the Department of Public Works, Division of Aviation, for
29 the maintenance and operation of state airports during the fiscal

1 year ending June 30, 1964.

2 * Sec. 14. The sum of \$10,322 is appropriated from the general
3 fund to pay Mike Stepovich rent due for office space for the
4 Department of Labor in Fairbanks for April through October, 1963.
5 The sum of \$206.44 is appropriated from the general fund to pay
6 interest on this obligation.

7 * Sec. 15. The sum of \$9,842 is appropriated from the general
8 fund to pay the Anchorage Masonic Temple Holding Co., Inc., rent
9 due for office space for the Department of Law and Department of
10 Public Safety for April through October, 1963. The sum of \$196.84
11 is appropriated from the general fund to pay interest on this
12 obligation.

13 * Sec. 16. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage
14 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
