2 1. Legislation concerning state, federal, or local

3 programs to restore and to finance the restoration of public

4 and private property destroyed by the earthquake and related

5 action;

6 2. Legislation which may be required to prevent the

7 collapse of the business communities in the disaster areas

8 during the restoration of facilities and services, and to

9 prevent inflation;

10 3. Legislation to provide for needed extensions, if

11 any, of welfare and health protection services in the

12 disaster areas;

13 4. Legislation to provide for administrative powers

14 and organization relating to necessary disaster programs;

15 5. Legislation to anticipate and lessen the social and

16 economic harm of natural disasters should the state ever

17 again be faced with one of great magnitude; and be it

18 FURTHER RESOLVED that all memoranda, reports, and draft

19 legislation are to be made available to all members of the Legis-

20 lature and the Office of the Governor and that all staff work be

21 restricted to those duties or assignments required by law, direct-

22 ed by the Legislature and the Legislative Council, or requested

23 by the finance and other standing committees, until the Council

24 determines that service for individual legislators can be

25 restored.

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
