5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act making certain appropriations; and  
7 providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. The sum of \$100 is appropriated from the general  
10 fund to reimburse Juneau Broadcasters, Inc., and William J. Wagner  
11 and Irene F. Wagner for costs and attorney fees in accordance with  
12 the judgment filed in the Superior Court, State of Alaska, First  
13 District, at Juneau May 10, 1963, Civil Action File No. 63-14.

14 \* Sec. 2. The sum of \$303.62 is appropriated from the general  
15 fund to reimburse Ben Caldron and Sara Caldron for attorney fees  
16 in accordance with the judgment filed in the Superior Court,  
17 State of Alaska, Third District, at Anchorage, April 29, 1963.

18 \* Sec. 3. The sum of \$583.95 is appropriated from the general  
19 fund to reimburse Northern Consolidated Airlines for services  
20 furnished the Alaska Court System, the Department of Health and  
21 Welfare and the Department of Public Safety in prior fiscal years.

22 \* Sec. 4. The sum of \$240 is appropriated from the general  
23 fund to reimburse the Addressograph-Multigraph Corporation for  
24 equipment furnished the Department of Revenue during the fiscal  
25 year ending June 30, 1960.

26 \* Sec. 5. The sum of \$323.87 is appropriated from the general  
27 fund to reimburse the IBM Corporation for services furnished the  
28 Department of Highways in prior fiscal years.

29 \* Sec. 6. The sum of \$80.96 is appropriated from the general

1 fund to reimburse the General Services Administration for equip-  
2 ment furnished the Alaska Court System during the fiscal year  
3 ending June 30, 1960.

4 \* Sec. 7. The sum of \$624 is appropriated from the general  
5 fund to reimburse Dr. J. Ray Langdon for consulting services  
6 provided for the Department of Health and Welfare during the  
7 fiscal year ending June 30, 1961.

8 \* Sec. 8. The sum of \$28 is appropriated from the general  
9 fund to reimburse Laurel Ragona for services furnished the Depart-  
10 ment of Health and Welfare during the fiscal year ending June 30,  
11 1962.

12 \* Sec. 9. The sum of \$914.35 is appropriated from the general  
13 fund to reimburse Frank W. Coletta for losses incurred as a result  
14 of rendering services for the Department of Public Safety in July,  
15 1963.

16 \* Sec. 10. The sum of \$340.48 is appropriated from the general  
17 fund to reimburse the Firestone Tire and Rubber Company for  
18 supplies furnished the Department of Public Safety during 1959,  
19 1960 and 1961.

20 \* Sec. 11. The sum of \$13,595.50 is appropriated from the  
21 general fund to reimburse Harvey Hodge and Alma Billie Hodge,  
22 d/b/a Wrangell Cleaners and Laundry, in accordance with a judgment  
23 issued by the Superior Court for the State of Alaska, First  
24 Judicial District, on December 2, 1964, Civil Action No. 64-38.

25 \* Sec. 12. The sum of \$779.00 is appropriated from the general  
26 fund to reimburse Walter G. Pippel for attorney's fees and costs  
27 in accordance with a judgment issued by the Superior Court for  
28 the State of Alaska, Third Judicial District, on January 10, 1964,  
29 Civil Action No. 61-712.

1       \* Sec. 13. The sum of \$250.00 is appropriated from the general  
2 fund to reimburse James K. Tallman for attorney's fees and costs  
3 in accordance with a judgment issued by the Superior Court for  
4 the State of Alaska, Third Judicial District, on September 25,  
5 1964, Civil Action No. 62-1196.

6       \* Sec. 14. The sum of \$437.48 is appropriated from the general  
7 fund to the Department of Revenue for the reissue of stale date  
8 warrants.

9       \* Sec. 15. The sum of \$56,900 is appropriated from the general  
10 fund representing National Forest Receipts to be apportioned to  
11 the eligible political subdivisions of the state according to the  
12 statutes and regulations authorizing the apportionment.

13       \* Sec. 16. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage  
14 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.  
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
