5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the Civil Air Patrol;  
7 and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. PURPOSE. The Civil Air Patrol is an auxiliary of  
10 the United States Air Force operating under charter from Congress,  
11 and it operates in all states and the District of Columbia and the  
12 Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. The Civil Air Patrol has as its  
13 purpose the organizing of public-spirited citizens in civil avia-  
14 tion into a volunteer semi-military organization to assist in civil  
15 defense efforts, train teen-age cadets in pre-flight instruction,  
16 conduct missing-aircraft search service, and assist in search and  
17 rescue missions, and special missions for state and federal  
18 agencies. It is the purpose of this Act to make formal provision  
19 for the administration of the financial support of the state's  
20 participation in the program of the Civil Air Patrol.

21 \* Sec. 2. AS 44.33.020 is amended by adding a new paragraph  
22 to read:

23 (10) act as liaison between the state and the  
24 Civil Air Patrol, provide it with assistance, and administer  
25 appropriations made for the Civil Air Patrol.

26 \* Sec. 3. AS 44.33 is amended by adding a new section to read:

27 ARTICLE 3. CIVIL AIR PATROL.

28 Sec. 44.33.110. ADMINISTRATION. The commissioner of  
29 commerce shall make the necessary administrative arrangements

1 for maintaining liaison between the state and the Civil Air  
2 Patrol and the expenditure of funds appropriated to the  
3 department for the state contribution toward the support of  
4 the authorized activities of the Alaska Wing, Civil Air  
5 Patrol.

6 \* Sec. 4. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage  
7 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
