6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the duality of office
7 of members of the legislature."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 24.05.040 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 24.05.040. DUAL OFFICE. No member of the legis-
11 lature may hold any other office or position of profit under
12 the United States or the state. During the term for which
13 elected and for one year thereafter, no legislator may be
14 nominated, elected or appointed to any other office or posi-
15 tion of profit which has been created, or the salary or
16 emoluments of which have been increased while he was a member.
17 This section does not prevent any person from seeking or
18 holding the office of governor, secretary of state, or mem-
19 ber of Congress. This section does not apply to employment
20 by or election to a constitutional convention. A member may
21 serve on or at the behest of an interim committee of the
22 legislature. An office of profit as used in this section
23 means an elective office on the state or federal levels of
24 government, the holder of which is entitled to a salary; a
25 position of profit means an appointive position on the state
26 or federal levels of government, the holder of which has the
27 authority to make policy and is entitled to a salary for his
28 services. Employment as a "teacher" as defined in
29 AS 14.17.250(12) shall not be deemed holding an office or
