6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to entering upon land or
7 premises owned by another."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 11.20.630 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

10 Sec. 11.20.630. TRESPASS. (a) It is illegal for a
11 person other than an officer on lawful business to enter the
12 lands or premises owned by another if

13 (1) the lands or premises are posted with written
14 notice which prohibits trespassing and which should have been
15 discovered by a person exercising due care; or

16 (2) the person did know or should have known the
17 lands or premises were privately owned, provided, if the
18 lands are vacant and unimproved, such entering shall be un-
19 lawful only if the person entering such lands fails, neglects,
20 or refuses to depart immediately upon verbal notice from the
21 owner or his personal representative; or

22 (3) the lands or premises are fenced or improved.

23 (b) It is illegal for a person who enters lands or
24 premises with the permission of the owner or lessee to remain
25 if the owner or lessee requests him to leave.

26 (c) Permission to enter the lands or premises of another
27 is not presumed or implied if the owner or lessee consented
28 to such entering on a previous occasion and limited his
29 consent to that occasion.

(d) A person who violates (a) or (b) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction is punishable by imprisonment in a jail for 30 days, or by a fine of not more than \$250, or by both.
