6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the issuance of bev-
7 erage dispensary licenses; and providing for
8 an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 04.15.020(e) is amended to read:

11 (e) Churches and schools. The board shall not issue
12 a beverage dispensary license or package liquor store
13 license for the sale of any intoxicating liquor in any
14 building within 200 feet of a school ground or church,
15 building measured by the shortest direct line from the
16 school ground or church building in which religious serv-
17 ices are conducted, within or without any corporate munici-
18 pality nor for use in any building within two miles of an
19 accredited college or university certified by Northwest
20 Association for the Accrediting of Institutions of Formal
21 Education. The board shall issue a beverage dispensary,
22 package liquor store or any other alcoholic beverage license
23 to any such accredited college or university for its use
24 or the use of its faculty, students or personnel on campus,
25 or to any other qualified applicant, at any place more than
26 200 feet and less than two miles from any college or uni-
27 versity campus or ground actually used and occupied for edu-
28 ational purposes, on the written recommendation of the board
29 of regents or otherwise designated governing body of the

1 directly affected college or university. A license may be
2 reissued or transferred from one licensee to another, for
3 the sale of intoxicating liquor in a building in which that
4 sale was authorized by law on April 25, 1960. When a
5 license for the sale of intoxicating liquor in a building
6 within 200 feet of a school ground or church building in
7 which religious services are conducted is forfeited, lapses
8 or is transferred to other premises, no license for the
9 sale of intoxicating liquor at the prior licensed location
10 shall thereafter be issued. However, the location may be
11 relicensed in the event of the removal of either cause of
12 the restriction.

13 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage
14 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
