6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the computation of permit
7 fees for bingo, raffles, ice pools and re-
8 lated activities; and providing for an
9 effective date."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 * Section 1. AS 05.15.020 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

12 Sec. 05.15.020. ANNUAL PERMIT AND FEES. (a) No
13 activity permitted under this chapter may be conducted unless
14 an annual permit is obtained from the department:

15 (b) The fee for an annual permit is a basic fee of \$20
16 plus a gross receipts fee which is based upon the annual
17 gross receipts of the permittee according to the following
18 formula:

<u>Annual Gross Receipts</u>	<u>Gross Receipts Fee</u>
\$ 0 - 999	\$ 0
1,000 - 4,999	30
5,000 - 9,999	75
10,000 - 19,999	150
20,000 - 49,999	350
50,000 - 99,999	750
100,000 - and over	1,000

27 (c) The basic fee of \$20 is due and payable when
28 application for a permit is made and the gross receipts fee
29 is due on December 31 of the calendar year for which a permit

1 is issued and shall be paid on or before January 31 of the
2 following calendar year. An applicant is not eligible for a
3 permit for a current calendar year unless all fees for the
4 preceding calendar year are paid on or before January 31 of
5 the current calendar year. An applicant who is not eligible
6 for a permit for a current calendar year because of failure
7 to pay all fees for the preceding year is eligible for a
8 permit for the calendar year which follows the current calen-
9 dar year if all overdue fees are paid on or before July 1 of
10 the current calendar year and the applicant otherwise quali-
11 fies for the permit.

12 (d) A permit issued under this section is valid until
13 January 31 of the year following the calendar year for which
14 the permit is issued.

15 (e) No activity is permitted for a period of 15 days
16 after application.

17 * Sec. 2. AS 05.15.040 is amended to read:

18 Sec. 05.15.040. ISSUANCE AND EFFECT AND TERM OF PERMIT.
19 After the basic fee is paid, a permit issued, and during the
20 effective period of the permit, the organization may conduct
21 the activity specified in the permit. If a permit is revoked,
22 the permittee is not eligible for another permit until the
23 expiration of one year from the date of revocation. A permit
24 expires at the end of the period for which it is issued. A
25 permit is not transferable.

26 * Sec. 3. AS 05.15.070 is amended to read:

27 Sec. 05.15.070. COMMISSIONER OF REVENUE MAY EXAMINE
28 PERMITTEES. The commissioner may examine or have examined
29 the books and records of a permittee. [THE COMMISSIONER MAY

1 REQUIRE THE PERMITTEE TO PAY THE REASONABLE COST OF THE
2 EXAMINATION.] The commissioner may issue subpoenas for the
3 attendance of witnesses and the production of books, records,
4 and other documents.

5 * Sec. 4. This Act takes effect January 1, 1966.
