5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act creating and providing for a Com-  
7 mission on Executive Reorganization; and  
8 providing for an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 \* Section 1. COMMISSION CREATED. There is created a Commis-  
11 sion on Executive Reorganization.

12 \* Sec. 2. COMPOSITION OF COMMISSION. The commission consists  
13 of five members appointed by the governor on a bipartisan basis  
14 and confirmed by the legislature. One of the appointees shall be  
15 a former governor of the State or Territory of Alaska who serves  
16 as the full-time chairman of the commission. Members are appoint-  
17 ed to serve for three-year overlapping terms.

18 \* Sec. 3. PURPOSE OF COMMISSION. It is the purpose of the  
19 commission to make studies, issue reports and make recommendations  
20 to the legislature on the administration and management of the  
21 public business by the agencies of the executive branch and to  
22 report findings and recommendations regarding the elimination of  
23 unnecessary duplication, compliance with the law and legislative  
24 directives, and the creation, combination or dissolution of  
25 agencies.

26 \* Sec. 4. REPORTS. The commission shall report annually to  
27 the legislature on its findings and recommendations by February  
28 15 but it may make as many interim reports as it finds advisable.

29 \* Sec. 5. COMPENSATION OF MEMBERS. (a) The chairman of the

1 commission serves on a full-time basis and receives an annual  
2 salary equal to that of the commissioner of administration.

3 (b) Members of the commission other than the chairman  
4 receive the standard per diem paid members of boards and commis-  
5 sions for each day of travel to and from meetings and while  
6 attending meetings of the commission.

7 \* Sec. 6. MEETINGS AND TRAVEL. The commission shall meet at  
8 least twice a year and at such other times as the chairman or a  
9 majority of the members of the board determine a meeting is  
10 necessary. Members travel to and from commission meetings at  
11 state expense and their travel is governed by AS 39.20.180.

12 \* Sec. 7. STAFF ASSISTANCE. The chairman may hire the techni-  
13 cal and clerical staff for work which the commission requires  
14 within the limits of the appropriation made to the commission.

15 \* Sec. 8. AGENCY COOPERATION. The chairman and the commission  
16 may call upon all agencies of the executive branch for such  
17 assistance, information, records, documents, and testimony it may  
18 require to carry out its purpose.

19 \* Sec. 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect on January  
20 1, 1967.
