6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the Health Facilities
7 Advisory Council; and providing for an
8 effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 18.05.051 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

11 Sec. 18.05.051. HEALTH FACILITIES ADVISORY COUNCIL.

12 (a) There is created a Health Facilities Advisory Council
13 which shall consist of governmental and nongovernmental
14 members.

15 (b) The council shall include eleven nongovernmental
16 members, seven of whom shall be consumers and four of whom
17 shall be representatives of nongovernmental agencies, who are
18 concerned with hospital services, medical facilities, com-
19 munity mental health facilities, and facilities for the
20 mentally retarded.

21 (1) Nongovernmental members are appointed by the
22 governor subject to confirmation by a majority of the members
23 of the legislature in joint session. Four members shall
24 serve initial terms of two years, four members initial terms
25 of three years, and three members initial terms of four years
26 Initial terms date from February 1 before appointment.
27 Thereafter, terms of office are four years, unless the
28 appointment is for the remainder of an unexpired term. Each
29 member holds office at the pleasure of the governor

notwithstanding the member's term.

(2) Nongovernmental members may carry out their duties on the council after appointment but prior to confirmation or rejection by the legislature.

(3) Nongovernmental members receive no salary but are entitled to per diem and travel expenses authorized by law for state boards. Nongovernmental members may receive travel expenses and per diem in connection with the exercise of their duties as council members prior to their confirmation or rejection by the legislature.

(c) The council shall include four governmental members: two from the Department of Health and Welfare; one from the Department of Administration; and the commissioner of health and welfare. The governmental members other than the commissioner of health and welfare, are appointed by the governor. The commissioner of health and welfare shall act as chairman of the council.

(d) The governor shall appoint two advisors to the council; one of whom shall be from the Department of Labor and one of whom shall be from the Department of Education who shall represent education and vocational rehabilitation.

(e) Additional members may be appointed under this section by the governor as required by federal law. The terms of such additional members shall be four years, or in case of conflict with federal law, that required by federal law.

Sec. 18.05.053. POWERS AND DUTIES. The Health Facilities Advisory Council shall:

(1) advise and consult with the commissioner of

1 health and welfare regarding:

2 (A) programs for the construction of health
3 facilities for the state and its political subdivisions;

4 (B) the development of rules, regulations, and
5 standards for the operation of health facilities;

6 (2) request the cooperation of governmental and
7 nongovernmental agencies in planning and developing programs
8 relating to the rehabilitation, education, employment, health
9 and welfare of health facilities;

10 (3) exercise such additional powers and perform
11 such duties as are necessary to obtain financial assistance
12 under federal programs.

14 Sec. 18.05.055. DEFINITIONS. In secs. 051 and 053 of
15 this chapter:

16 (1) "consumer" means a "consumer" as defined in
17 Title VI of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. § 291
18 et seq.) and the Mental Retardation Facilities and Community
19 Mental Health Centers Construction Act of 1963 (P.L. 88-164)
20 and as it may be amended in the future;

21 (2) "health facilities" includes hospitals, medi-
22 cal facilities, nonprofit hospitals, nonprofit medical
23 facilities, public health centers, community mental health
24 centers, facilities for the mentally retarded, and nonprofit
25 facilities for the mentally retarded.

26 * Sec. 4. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage
27 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
