6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to persons 19 or 20 years of
7 age entering restaurants, which are also
8 licensed to sell alcoholic beverages, for the
9 purpose of dining."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 * Section 1. AS 04.15.020(d) is amended to read:

12 (d) Presence of minors on premises. It is unlawful to
13 permit a person under the age of 21 years to enter licensed
14 premises unless the minor is accompanied by his parent,
15 guardian or spouse who has attained the age of 21 years.
16 However, a person who is 19 or 20 years of age may enter
17 licensed premises which is also recognized as a restaurant
18 for the purpose of dining. The Alcoholic Beverage Control
19 Board, with the approval of the city council if the premises
20 are within the city or with the approval of the borough
21 assembly if the premises are outside the city but within a
22 borough, shall designate which premises are restaurants for
23 the purposes of this section. The Alcoholic Beverage Control
24 Board shall promulgate regulations for the designation of
25 restaurants and the continuation or withdrawal of the
26 designation. Any provision herein to the contrary notwith-
27 standing, no establishment shall be designated as a restaurant
28 for purposes of dining without the consent of the licensee.
