6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to state aid to kinder-  
7 gartens of public schools under the Public  
8 School Foundation Program; and providing  
9 for an effective date."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 \* Section 1. AS 14.17 is amended by adding a new section to  
12 read:

13 Sec. 14.17.025. AID FOR KINDERGARTENS. A district may  
14 elect to receive or not to receive state aid for its kinder-  
15 gartens under this chapter.

16 \* Sec. 2. AS 14.17.030(b) is amended to read:

17 (b) The required local tax effort for each district is  
18 the amount of revenue raised from local sources which, if  
19 the district elects to receive state aid for its kinder-  
20 gartens, is equivalent to the amount which would be raised  
21 from a -mill levy on the full and true value of taxable  
22 real and personal property within the district, or, if the  
23 district elects not to receive state aid for its kinder-  
24 gartens, is equivalent to the amount which would be raised  
25 from a 3.5-mill levy on the full and true value of taxable  
26 real and personal property within the district. The amount  
27 of the required local tax effort may be raised from any  
28 source available to the district and does not have to be  
29 derived from property taxes.

2 (1) "average daily membership" means the aggregate  
3 days of membership of pupils in grades one through twelve  
4 and, if the district has elected to receive state aid for  
5 its kindergartens, one-half of the aggregate days of member-  
6 ship of kindergarten pupils divided by the actual number of  
7 days the school is in session for the year;

8 \* Sec. 4. AS 14.17.250(4) is amended to read:

9 (4) "Elementary school" means a school consisting  
10 of grades one through eight, kindergarten through eight, or  
11 an appropriate combination of grades within this range;

12 \* Sec. 5. This Act takes effect on July 1, 1966.
