6 For an Act entitled: "An Act penalizing persons who loiter about
7 public schools as vagrants; and providing
8 for an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 11.60.210 is amended to read:

11 Sec. 11.60.210. VAGRANCY. An idle or dissolute person
12 who has no visible means of living, or lawful occupation or
13 employment by which to earn a living; an able-bodied person
14 found begging the means of support in public places, or from
15 house to house, or who procures a child or children to do so;
16 or a person who lives in a house of ill repute; or a person
17 who, without legitimate reason, loiters about a school where
18 children are in attendance is a vagrant, and upon conviction
19 is punishable by a fine of not less than \$20 nor more than
20 \$250, or by imprisonment in a jail for not less than 10 days
21 nor more than 25 days, or by both.

22 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage
23 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
