6 Olympic Games in 1971 at Mt.
7 Alyeska.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE SENATE
9 CONCURRING:

10 WHEREAS, the success of the Olympic Ski Trials held at Mt.
11 Alyeska in 1963 demonstrated the suitability of the mountain and
12 the facilities there for expert skiing events; and

13 WHEREAS, the central location of Anchorage, its ready
14 accessibility by air from all parts of the globe, its many fine
15 restaurants, hotels, and inns, and its excellent winter climate
16 all recommend it as a place eminently suited as a center for
17 winter sporting competitions; and

18 WHEREAS, it would be enormously beneficial to the future
19 development of the state to focus the attention of the world on
20 the enormous skiing potential found in the state; and

21 WHEREAS, the flow of competitors and visitors to the state
22 for an event of the significance of the 1971 Winter Olympic games
23 would be of great economic importance to the whole state;

24 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska Travel Division of the Depart-
25 ment of Economic Development and Planning is urged to take every
26 possible action to ensure that maximum consideration is given by
27 the authorities responsible for choosing the location of the
28 Winter Olympics to holding them at Mt. Alyeska, Alaska.
