5 Requesting the Governor to direct
6 the Department of Education to take
7 steps necessary to accomplish sound
8 and full implementation of a
9 regional high school system.

10 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 WHEREAS the establishment of a system of regional high
12 schools is the most effective method of overcoming the present
13 inability of the state to afford many of its citizens an adequate
14 education; and

15 WHEREAS the legislature has authorized, provided funding for,
16 and prescribed the general guidelines for establishment of a
17 regional high school system; and

18 WHEREAS final implementation is contingent upon the determina-
19 tion of specific facts and upon the making of specific decisions;

20 BE IT RESOLVED that the Governor at his discretion is re-
21 quested to contract with private entities and to direct the
22 various state departments, as is necessary, to make a compre-
23 hensive study relative to the absorption of children into a
24 regional high school system; and be it

25 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor is requested to report the
26 findings of the study to the members of the legislature, the
27 public, and the press by October 15, 1966; and be it

28 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor is requested to direct the
29 Department of Education to immediately select locations for

regional high schools to the extent that information is available and to subsequently select other locations in accordance with the results of the study, to provide for the necessary contracts with the district in which a regional high school will be located, and to provide for the necessary contracts to insure that the federal government will construct and provide funds for the operation of domiciliary facilities at each regional high school.
