HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 54  
IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA  
FOURTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

Directing a study of motor  
vehicle safety inspection laws.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Alaska does not have a compulsory motor vehicle in-  
spection law; and

WHEREAS 20 states now have a compulsory motor vehicle in-  
spection law and the President's Committee for Traffic Safety  
reports that such laws result in the discovery of many defective  
vehicles and prohibits their being operated on the highways; and

WHEREAS the Alaska Safety Council established in 1965 has  
suggested the need for a study of other motor vehicle inspection  
laws, including laws relating to the use of motorized ski equip-  
ment, and a determination as to their effectiveness and the  
possible need for them in Alaska;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Council is directed to  
make an interim study on motor vehicle safety inspection laws  
used in other states and to report its findings and recommenda-  
tions to the Fifth Legislature in January of 1967.
