5 Relating to federal studies re-
6 garding the Rampart Dam Project.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 WHEREAS the Field Report on the Rampart Dam Project in Alaska
9 has been prepared from the studies made by the various field
10 agencies of the Department of the Interior; and

11 WHEREAS the Corps of Engineers of the United States Army has
12 prepared a comprehensive report on the feasibility and conse-
13 quences of the construction of the Rampart Dam; and

14 WHEREAS upon completion, this project would furnish needed
15 power to areas both within and without the state and therefore
16 prompt consideration of, and action upon, these reports are vital
17 to the development of the state and to the welfare of the United
18 States; and

19 WHEREAS the Secretary of the Interior appointed a task force
20 to analyze the Field Report some months ago and that task force
21 has not as yet advised the Secretary of the Interior of its con-
22 clusions;

23 BE IT RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior is urgently
24 requested to obtain the conclusions and recommendations of his
25 task force at the earliest possible moment and to release the
26 report at the earliest possible moment with his conclusions and
27 recommendations; and be it

28 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Corps of Engineers, United States
29 Army, is urged to submit its report to Congress at the earliest

1 possible moment.
