2 HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 62

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 FOURTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 Requesting the Bureau of Indian  
6 Affairs to reopen the cannery at  
7 Hydaburg.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 WHEREAS the Bureau of Indian Affairs has closed the cannery  
10 at Hydaburg for the announced reasons that it is not economically  
11 feasible to operate canneries at both Hydaburg and Klawock, that  
12 of the two the Hydaburg cannery is the more expensive to operate,  
13 that it is obsolete, and that it would be too expensive to restore  
14 it to operating condition; and

15 WHEREAS no cost figures have been presented by the Bureau of  
16 Indian Affairs in support of the reasons for closure; and

17 WHEREAS of the two, the cannery at Hydaburg is, in fact,  
18 newer, cheaper to operate, and has a more suitable harbor for the  
19 ships serving the cannery; and

20 WHEREAS it is vital to the welfare of the people of Hydaburg  
21 that the cannery operate at least alternate years;

22 BE IT RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior is  
23 requested to reverse the decision regarding the Hydaburg cannery  
24 and to return the cannery to a minimum of alternate years opera-  
25 tion;

27 Stewart L. Udall, Secretary of the Interior, the Honorable Philleo  
28 Nash, Commissioner of Indian Affairs, the Honorable Owen  
29 Morken, Area Director, Bureau of Indian Affairs; the Honorable

1 William A. Egan, Governor of Alaska; and the Honorable E. L.  
2 Bartlett and the Honorable Ernest Gruening, U. S. Senators, and  
3 the Honorable Ralph J. Rivers, U. S. Representative, members of the  
4 Alaska delegation in Congress.
