6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to sabbatical leave for
7 teachers; providing the maximum number of
8 teachers who may receive a salary while on
9 leave; and providing for an effective date."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 * Section 1. AS 14.20.280 is amended to read:

12 Sec. 14.20.280. BASIS OF LEAVE. A teacher who has
13 rendered active service for seven or more years in a public
14 school system in the state is entitled to sabbatical leave,
15 subject to the restrictions of secs. 280 - 350 of this
16 chapter. Sabbatical leave may be taken for educational pur-
17 poses only, and for not more than one school year. Subject
18 to the provisions of sec. 310(1) of this chapter, a [A]
19 teacher on sabbatical leave is entitled to one-half his base
20 salary to be paid in the usual manner.

21 * Sec. 2. AS 14.20.310(1) is repealed and re-enacted to read:

22 (1) up to and including one per cent of all
23 teachers in the state may be on paid sabbatical leave at any
24 one time, and such additional teachers as may be selected
25 under secs. 280 - 350 of this chapter may be on unpaid sab-
26 batical leave, provided no more than two per cent of all the
27 teachers in the state may be on sabbatical leave at any one
28 time;
