5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to reapportionment of an  
7 organized borough assembly."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 07.20.030(3) is amended to read:

10 (3) Upon receipt of a petition, the assembly or  
11 Local Affairs Agency shall investigate its allegations and  
12 shall determine if the apportionment of the assembly meets  
13 the apportionment standards prescribed by this title. If it  
14 is determined that the standards are not met, the assembly or  
15 Local Affairs Agency shall reapportion the assembly accord-  
16 ingly. A reapportionment by the Local Affairs Agency pre-  
17 vails over one by an assembly. The reapportionment is  
18 effective at a time set by the assembly but not later than  
19 [BEGINNING WITH] the next regular election to the assembly.

20 \* Sec. 2. AS 07.20.030 is amended by adding a new paragraph  
21 to read:

22 (4) If a reapportionment which results in an in-  
23 crease of representation on the assembly is made effective  
24 before the next regular election to the assembly, an addi-  
25 tional office on the assembly shall be filled as prescribed  
26 by AS 07.30.070(2) - (3) for filling vacancies. The term of  
27 office shall run until the next regular election and until a  
28 successor is selected or elected and qualified to serve a  
29 full term of office.
