10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 \* Section 1. AS 11.30 is amended by adding a new section to  
12 read:

13 Sec. 11.30.265. FALSE AND FRAUDULENT STATEMENTS AND  
14 CLAIMS PROHIBITED. (a) No person shall, with regard to any  
15 matter within the jurisdiction of any department or agency of  
16 the state, knowingly and wilfully:

17 (1) falsify, conceal or cover up by any trick,  
18 scheme or device, a material fact;

19 (2) make any false, fictitious or fraudulent  
20 statement or representation, either orally or in writing;

21 (3) make or use any false writing or documents  
22 knowing the same to contain any false, fictitious or fraudu-  
23 lent statement or entry; or

24 (4) make or present any claim upon or against the  
25 state or any department or agency of the state, knowing  
26 such claim to be false, fictitious or fraudulent.

27 (b) For purposes of this section a fact is material if  
28 it has a natural tendency to influence, or is capable of  
29 influencing, the decision of the department or agency in

making a determination required to be made.

(c) A person convicted of any offense under this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and is punishable by imprisonment for not to exceed one year, or by a fine not to exceed \$1,000, or by both.

\* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
