7 temporary employees of the legislature; and

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 24.15.060 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

11 Sec. 24.15.060. COMPENSATION. (a) Temporary session
12 employees of the legislature are compensated for each
13 calendar day of the legislative session according to the
14 following schedule:

26 (b) The daily compensation provided for in (a) of this
27 section applies for each day of the session the employee is

at the direction of the legislative council shall be paid on an hourly basis for hours actually worked as determined by dividing the authorized daily compensation for each position by seven, the number seven representing the average working hours each day. During sessions, all employees are employed with the understanding that they will work as many hours as may be required by their supervisors with the approval of the Rules Committees. All temporary employees are on call for duty every day of the session.

* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect retroactively to February 1, 1965.
