6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to per diem payments for
7 state employees."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 39.20.110 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 39.20.110. PER DIEM ALLOWANCE. Officials and
11 employees of the state agencies, while traveling on official
12 business and away from their designated post of duty, shall
13 be allowed, instead of their actual expenses for subsistence
14 and all fees or tips, a per diem allowance of \$25 [TO BE
15 PRESCRIBED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF ADMINISTRATION UNDER THE
16 REGULATORY AUTHORITY SET OUT IN SEC. 160 OF THIS CHAPTER,
17 AND IN CONSULTATION WITH THE HEAD OF THE AGENCY CONCERNED,
18 NOT TO EXCEED THE RATE OF \$21 FOR TRAVEL INSIDE OR OUTSIDE
19 THE STATE].

20 * Sec. 2. AS 39.20.160 is amended to read:

21 Sec. 39.20.160. REGULATIONS. [THE FIXING AND PAYMENT]
22 Under secs. 110 - 170 of this chapter the payment of [OF TRAVEL
23 AND] per diem allowances and the fixing and payment of travel
24 allowances and [OF] advances and recovery and reimbursement
25 of travel expenses shall be in accordance with regulations
26 adopted by the commissioner of administration. The regula-
27 tions shall be uniform for all officials and employees, and
28 all agencies and departments. The regulations shall also
29 govern the use of public transportation facilities by

officials and employees. The regulations relate to the internal management of state agencies and their adoption is not subject to the Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62).
