BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 29.25 is amended by adding a new section to

Sec. 29.25.185. COMPENSATION. The council may by
ordinance fix a compensation for members of the council for
the performance of duties as councilmen. A compensation may
be fixed for the council president which is higher than that
for other members of the council.

Sec. 29.25.190. APPOINTMENT. The council may appoint a
clerk, a treasurer who shall be bonded in an amount not to
exceed \$10,000 as determined by the council, an assessor, a
chief of police, and such other officers or employees as it
considers necessary, and may fix their compensation by
ordinance. No officer or employee may be appointed for a
term longer than one year nor beyond the term for which mem-
bers of the council are elected. The council may, if it
elects, select a clerk, [OR] treasurer, and other officers or
employees [OR BOTH] from among its own number and may by
ordinance fix a compensation for performance of the duties of
the office or employment. The compensation shall be payable
in addition to compensation which may be fixed under
