6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the powers of councils
7 of fourth class cities."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 29.25 is amended by adding a new section to
10 read:

11 Sec. 29.25.185. COMPENSATION. The council may by
12 ordinance fix a compensation for members of the council for
13 the performance of duties as councilmen.

14 * Sec. 2. AS 29.25.190 is amended to read:

15 Sec. 29.25.190. APPOINTMENT. The council may appoint a
16 clerk, a treasurer who shall be bonded in an amount not to
17 exceed \$10,000 as determined by the council, an assessor, a
18 chief of police, and such other officers or employees as it
19 considers necessary, and may fix their compensation by
20 ordinance. No officer or employee may be appointed for a
21 term longer than one year nor beyond the term for which mem-
22 bers of the council are elected. The council may, if it
23 elects, select a clerk, [OR] treasurer, and other officers or
24 employees [OR BOTH] from among its own number and may by
25 ordinance ratified by a majority of the qualified voters
26 voting on the question at the next general election following
27 the selection fix a compensation for performance of the duties
28 of the office or employment. The compensation may be payable
29 in addition to compensation which may be fixed under

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sec. 185 of this chapter for the performance of duties as
councilmen and as council president [, BUT NO MEMBER
APPOINTED MAY RECEIVE COMPENSATION FOR PERFORMING DUTIES
OF THE OFFICES].
