6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to probationary status of  
7 employees in the classified service; and  
8 providing for an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 \* Section 1. AS 39.25.150(7) is amended to read:

11 (7) a period of probation not to exceed one year  
12 before any appointment to a position in a given job class  
13 becomes [OR PROMOTION IS] permanent, except that any promo-  
14 tional appointment to a position in the same job class becomes  
15 permanent at the time of the promotional appointment; however  
16 persons receiving promotional appointments to positions not  
17 in the same job class as the position previously held shall  
18 serve the prescribed probationary period;

19 \* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage  
20 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
