Sec. 22.20.030. POWER OF JUDICIAL OFFICERS AND DESIG-  
12 NATED EMPLOYEES. (a) A judicial officer may

(1) preserve and enforce order in his immediate  
14 presence, and in the proceedings before him, when he is  
15 engaged in the performance of a duty imposed upon him by law;

(2) compel obedience to his lawful orders, as pro-  
17 vided by law;

(3) compel the attendance of persons to testify  
19 in a proceeding pending before him in the cases and manner  
20 provided by law;

(4) administer oaths to persons, in a proceeding  
22 pending before him, and in all other cases where it may be

**(7) take and certify an affidavit or deposition to be used in any court of justice or other tribunal of the state.**

**(b) The clerk of any court and any deputy clerk designated by order of any court may exercise the powers of judicial officers specified in (a)(4), (5), (6) and (7) of this section.**

**\* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.**
