6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the minimum salary scale
7 for teachers; and providing for an effective
8 date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 14.20.220 is amended to read:

11 Sec. 14.20.220. MINIMUM TEACHERS' SALARY SCALE BY AREA
12 [SENATE DISTRICT]. (a) The school board of each school
13 district in the Southeastern area [SENATE DISTRICT] shall
14 pay a regularly qualified teacher employed by it a salary
15 not less than that set out in this subsection.

16 (1) The base salary of a teacher with three years'
17 training is \$5,000 [\$4,750] for a teacher with no public
18 school experience in the state. The salary is augmented by
19 \$200 [\$150] for each year of public school experience in the
20 state up to and including five [FOUR] years.

21 (2) The base salary for a teacher holding a
22 bachelor's degree and having the requisite number of hours
23 in education is \$6,000 [\$5,500]. This salary is augmented by
24 the sum of .04 times the base for each year of public school
25 experience in the state up to and including eight years.

26 (3) The base salary for a teacher having a mas-
27 ter's degree and the required number of hours of education is
28 \$6,500 [\$6,000]. This salary is augmented by the sum of .04
29 times the base for each year of teaching experience in the

1 state up to and including 12 years.

2 (b) The school board of each school district in the
3 Southcentral area [SENATE DISTRICT] shall pay the amount set
4 out in (a) of this section plus \$400.

5 (c) The school board of each school district in the
6 Central area [AND NORTHWEST SENATE DISTRICTS AND THAT PART
7 OF THE SOUTHCENTRAL SENATE DISTRICT LYING WEST OF 152° WEST
8 LONGITUDE] shall pay the amount set out in (a) of this
9 section plus \$700.

10 (d) The department, as the operating agency of schools
11 outside school districts, shall pay a regularly qualified
12 teacher employed by the state a salary of not less than
13 \$500 a year plus the usual housing allowance above the salary
14 established by either [SET OUT IN] (a), (b), [AND] (c) or (f)
15 of this section, with an increment of \$300 for a bachelor's
16 degree plus 18 hours training, and an equal increment of \$300
17 for a master's degree plus 18 hours training. However, in the
18 state-operated schools, instead of augmenting the base salary
19 by .04, each salary shall be augmented by .05 times the
20 base for each year of public school experience in the state
21 up to and including eight years for teachers with a bache-
22 lor's degree, 10 years for teachers with a bachelor's degree
23 plus 18 hours of training, 12 years for teachers with a
24 master's degree, and 14 years for teachers with a master's
25 degree plus 18 hours of training.

26 (e) Not more than five [FOUR] years of public school
27 experience outside the state may be substituted for a like
28 period of public school experience in the state when a
29 teacher's position on the salary scale is established.

1 (f) The school board of each school district in the
2 Northwest area shall pay the amount set out in (a) of this
3 section plus \$900.

4 (g) In addition to any other amounts to which a teacher
5 is entitled, a regularly qualified teacher employed in the
6 Southeastern area shall be paid the amount of \$200.

8 Sec. 14.20.230. SUPERINTENDENTS' SALARIES. The school
9 boards of school districts and the department as the operat-
10 ing agency for schools outside school districts shall pay a
11 regularly qualified superintendent a salary not less than
12 the allowable base for his position on the teacher's scale
13 provided in sec. 220(a) - (f) [(A), (B), (C), (D), AND (E)]
14 of this chapter, plus

15 (1) 20 per cent of the base for a superintendent
16 of a district or state school with an average daily member-
17 ship of less than 500;

18 (2) 25 per cent of the base for a superintendent
19 of a district or state school with an average daily member-
20 ship of 500 or more.

21 * Sec. 3. AS 14.20.240 is amended to read:

22 Sec. 14.20.240. SALARIES OF PRINCIPALS AND VICE
23 PRINCIPALS. The school boards of school districts and the
24 department as the operating agency for schools outside
25 districts shall pay each regularly qualified principal and
26 vice principal a salary not less than the allowable base for
27 his position on the teachers' scale provided in sec. 220(a) -
28 (f) [(A), (B), (C), (D), AND (E)] of this chapter, plus

29 (1) 15 per cent of the base for a principal;

(2) 10 per cent of the base for a vice principal.

* Sec. 4. AS 14.20.245 is amended to read:

Sec. 14.20.245. SALARIES OF OTHER ADMINISTRATORS. The school boards of school districts and the department as the operating agency for schools outside districts shall pay a regularly qualified administrator for whom certification is required, other than a superintendent, assistant superintendent, principal, or vice principal, a salary not less than the allowable base for his position on the teachers' scale provided in sec. 220 (a) - (f) [(E)] of this chapter plus 15 per cent of the base.

* Sec. 5. AS 14.20 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 14.20.275. DEFINITIONS. In sec. 220 of this chapter

(1) "Central area" means that area included within the boundaries of election districts 13, 14, 15, and 16;

(2) "Northwest area" means that area included within the boundaries of election districts 11, 12, 17, 18, and 19;

(3) "Southcentral area" means that area included within the boundaries of election districts 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10;

(4) "Southeastern area" means that area included within the boundaries of election districts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5.

* Sec. 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 1966.
