5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the minimum salary scale
7 for teachers; and providing for an effective
8 date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 14.20.220 is amended to read:

11 Sec. 14.20.220. MINIMUM TEACHERS' SALARY SCALE BY AREA
12 [SENATE DISTRICT]. (a) The school board of each school
13 district in the Southeastern area [SENATE DISTRICT] shall pay
14 a regularly qualified teacher employed by it a salary not
15 less than that set out in this subsection.

16 (1) The base salary of a teacher with three years'
17 training is \$5,000 [\$4,750] for a teacher with no public
18 school experience in the state. The salary is augmented by
19 \$200 [\$150] for each year of public school experience in the
20 state up to and including four years.

21 (2) The base salary for a teacher holding a
22 bachelor's degree and having the requisite number of hours
23 in education is \$6,000 [\$5,500]. This salary is augmented
24 by the sum of .04 times the base for each year of public
25 school experience in the state up to and including eight
26 years.

27 (3) The base salary for a teacher having a master's
28 degree and the required number of hours of education is
29 \$6,500 [\$6,000]. This salary is augmented by the sum of .04

1 times the base for each year of teaching experience in the
2 state up to and including 12 years.

3 (b) The school board of each school district in the
4 Southcentral area [SENATE DISTRICT] shall pay the amount set
5 out in (a) of this section plus \$300 [~~\$400~~].

6 (c) The school board of each school district in the
7 Central area [AND NORTHWEST SENATE DISTRICTS] and that part
8 of the Southcentral area [SENATE DISTRICT] lying west of 152°
9 West Longitude shall pay the amount set out in (a) of this
10 section plus \$700.

11 (d) The department, as the operating agency of schools
12 outside school districts, shall pay a regularly qualified
13 teacher employed by the state a salary of not less than \$500
14 a year plus the usual housing allowance above the salary
15 established by [SET OUT IN] (a), (b), [AND] (c), (f) or (g)
16 of this section, with an increment of \$300 for a bachelor's
17 degree plus 18 hours training, and an equal increment of
18 \$300 for a master's degree plus 18 hours training. However,
19 in the state-operated schools, instead of augmenting the base
20 salary by .04, each salary shall be augmented by .05 times
21 the base for each year of public school experience in the
22 state up to and including eight years for teachers with a
23 bachelor's degree, 10 years for teachers with a bachelor's
24 degree plus 18 hours of training, 12 years for teachers with
25 a master's degree, and 14 years for teachers with a master's
26 degree plus 18 hours of training.

27 (e) Not more than four years of public school experi-
28 ence outside the state may be substituted for a like period
29 of public school experience in the state when a teacher's

1 position on the salary scale is established.

2 (f) The school board of each school district in the
3 Northwest area shall pay the amount set out in (a) of this
4 section plus \$1,200.

5 (g) The school board of each school district in the
6 Southeast area shall pay the amount set out in (a) of this
7 section plus \$200.

8 * Sec. 2. AS 14.20.230 is amended to read:

9 Sec. 14.20.230. SUPERINTENDENTS' SALARIES. The school
10 boards of school districts and the department as the operat-
11 ing agency for schools outside school districts shall pay a
12 regularly qualified superintendent a salary not less than the
13 allowable base for his position on the teacher's scale pro-
14 vided in sec. 220(a) - (g) [200(A), (B), (C), (D), AND (E)]
15 of this chapter, plus

16 (1) 20 per cent of the base for a superintendent
17 of a district or state school with an average daily member-
18 ship of less than 500;

19 (2) 25 per cent of the base for a superintendent
20 of a district or state school with an average daily member-
21 ship of 500 or more.

22 * Sec. 3. AS 14.20.240 is amended to read:

23 Sec. 14.20.240. SALARIES OF PRINCIPALS AND VICE
24 PRINCIPALS. The school boards of school districts and the
25 department as the operating agency for schools outside dis-
26 tricts shall pay each regularly qualified principal and vice
27 principal a salary not less than the allowable base for his
28 position on the teachers' scale provided in sec. 220(a) - (g)
29 [220(A), (B), (C), (D), AND (E)] of this chapter, plus

1 (1) 15 per cent of the base for a principal;

2 (2) 10 per cent of the base for a vice principal.

3 * Sec. 4. AS 14.20.245 is amended to read:

4 Sec. 14.20.245. SALARIES OF OTHER ADMINISTRATORS. The
5 school boards of school districts and the department as the
6 operating agency for schools outside districts shall pay a
7 regularly qualified administrator for whom certification is
8 required, other than a superintendent, assistant superin-
9 tendent, principal, or vice principal, a salary not less than
10 the allowable base for his position on the teachers' scale
11 provided in sec. 220(a) - (g) [220(A) - (E)] of this chapter
12 plus 15 per cent of the base.

13 * Sec. 5. AS 14.20 is amended by adding a new section to read:

14 Sec. 14.20.275. DEFINITIONS. In sec. 220 of this
15 chapter

16 (1) "Central area" means that area included within
17 the boundaries of election districts 13, 14, 15, and 16;

18 (2) "Northwest area" means that area included
19 within the boundaries of election districts 17, 18, and 19;

20 (3) "Southcentral area" means that area included
21 within the boundaries of election districts 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11,
22 and 12;

23 (4) "Southeastern area" means that area included
24 within the boundaries of election districts 1, 2, 3, 4, and
25 5.

26 * Sec. 6. This Act takes effect on July 1, 1966.
