6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the distribution of  
7 revenue obtained from the sale of non-  
8 resident big game tags; and providing for  
9 an effective date."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 \* Section 1. AS 16.05.390 is amended to read:

12 Sec. 16.05.390. FEE FOR ISSUANCE OF LICENSES AND TAGS.

13 A person appointed and authorized by the commissioner of  
14 revenue to sell licenses and tags, except a salaried employee  
15 of the state, is entitled to keep five per cent of the fee  
16 for the issuance of each license or tag, or a fee of 25 cents,  
17 whichever is greater. Each person selling licenses or tags  
18 shall, as soon as practicable after the last day of each  
19 calendar month, transmit the proceeds from the sales, except  
20 the amount authorized to be retained, together with a report  
21 of the sales to the commissioner for deposit in the fish and  
22 game fund or the general fund or for distribution in accor-  
23 dance with the provisions of sec. 395 of this chapter.

24 \* Sec. 2. AS 16.05 is amended by adding a new section to read:

25 Sec. 16.05.395. DISTRIBUTION OF NONRESIDENT BIG GAME  
26 TAG FEES. Ninety per cent of the revenue received from the  
27 sale of a nonresident big game tag, excluding the sales  
28 commission authorized under sec. 390 of this chapter, shall  
29 be distributed to the treasury of the city or village which
