6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the operation of radio
7 beacons and the duty to give planes navi-
8 gational aid."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 02.10.040(3) is amended to read:

11 (3) the establishment of schedules for the con-
12 tinuous operation of these ground stations, including all
13 radio beacons or transmitters owned by the state or leased
14 from the state, together with the necessary arrangements for
15 these stations to receive weather and other data available
16 through other communication agencies;

17 * Sec. 2. AS 02.10 is amended by adding a new section to read:

18 Sec. 02.10.065. FAILURE TO TRANSMIT NAVIGATIONAL IN-
19 FORMATION. A person who wilfully refuses to transmit weather
20 or other navigational information to an aircraft within the
21 jurisdictional limits of the state is guilty of a felony and
22 upon conviction is punishable by a fine of not more than
23 \$5,000, or by imprisonment for not more than two years.

24 * Sec. 3. AS 02.10.070 is amended to read:

25 Sec. 02.10.070. PENALTIES. A person failing to comply
26 with the requirements, or violating any of the provisions of
27 this chapter, except sec. 65 of this chapter, or the rules,
28 regulations, or orders adopted by the department is guilty of
29 a misdemeanor, and punishable by a fine of not more than
