2 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 91

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 FOURTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 Relating to the personal exemptions
6 allowed under federal income tax
7 laws.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 WHEREAS the personal exemptions allowed under the federal in-
10 come tax laws have not been changed for many years; and

11 WHEREAS the present exemptions have become outdated because
12 they are not consonant with the current income structure of our
13 citizens; and

14 WHEREAS the benefits of an increased personal exemption al-
15 lowance would be of particular benefit to the lower income groups;

16 BE IT RESOLVED that the Congress of the United States is
17 urged to increase the allowances for the first two ordinary ex-
18 emptions to \$1,800 each, and retain the present exemption of \$600
19 for each additional dependent.
